Per our conversation, I would like to confirm that the drum liners from drums from Cordova should be sent to the Chemolite Incinerator for disposal. These liners should not be reused or combined with dry scrap for disposal.

The drum liners which contained hydrofluoric acid have been neutralized with sodium hydroxide would be considered hazardous and should be handled as a hazardous waste. A number of drum liners could be combined in a single drum and then sent to the incinerator for disposal using the Chemolite Hazardous Waste Manifest Form. Proper labels and waste identification should be included on these drums.
